Employees to vote on artwork for new hospital

Now through December 23rd employees can go onto the Intranet to vote for their favorite piece. The winner will be placed in the new hospital.

Employees now have a chance to pick their favorite artwork to be placed in the new hospital when the doors open in the spring of 2013. Now through December 23rd employees can log onto the intranet and vote for one of three pieces. The artwork with the most employee votes at the end of that time will be personally purchased by Dr. Jeff Barber, OMHS' president and CEO, and donated to the hospital in honor of OMHS employees.

“I want the employees to have a say in what their new hospital will look like,” said Barber. “Not just from a design and functionality standpoint but from a style and feel perspective.”


The art committee for the new hospital has been busy looking for artwork to spruce up the walls at the new hospital when it opens in 2013. Ann Murphy Kincheloe, the chair of the art committee, says the group is an arm of the design/finishing committee, which is choosing the decor and furniture for the new facility. Four works have already been picked for the hospital according to Kincheloe.

“I think it’s important to have healing pieces and interesting pieces,” Kincheloe said.

The three finalists for employees to vote on include pieces by Jim Cantrell, a painter and sculptor from Bardstown, Kentucky; Jenny Clark, a resident of Cincinnati, Ohio who currently works as a graphic designer and Diane Uebelhor-Wunderlich, a Newburgh, Indiana painter who has had several works reproduced for wildlife periodicals.

In addition to these pieces of artwork chosen for the new hospital, Kevin Red Star, an internationally acclaimed Native American painter, was commissioned to create a piece. His piece is on permanent loan to OMHS and will be on display at the current hospital.

McAuley Clinic opens the doors at its new location



One of the new exam rooms at the recently opened McAuley Clinic. The clinic opened the doors to its new location, at the corner of 9th and Center Streets, on Monday, December 12.

The clinic moved from the Daniel Pitino Shelter adjacent to OMHS on 9th and Center Streets.

The new McAuley Clinic opened its doors Monday morning, December 12 after moving from its old location and doing a little remodeling. The clinic will now serve patients at the corner of 9th and Center Streets, adjacent to the hospital.

“I hope the patients are patient with us because we’re in a new space and it’s going to take some time to adjust,” said Mary Danhauer, APRN with the McAuley Clinic.

The clinic hopes to have an open house after the first of year to show the public its new, larger space. Danhauer said the clinic went from just two exam rooms at the Daniel Pitino Shelter to five rooms at the new location. The detail was in the design, including color-coded tiles that correspond with the color of walls in exam rooms.

“We’re really excited,” Danhauer said. “We want this to be a welcoming and warm environment for our patients.”

The McAuley Clinic has been around since 1994 and sees thousands of patients each year.

The space is being leased to the hospital by the Wendell Foster’s Campus for Development Disabilities for \$1 per a year. The renovations were paid for through OMHS’ Community Benefit Grant program.

Epic email address now available

Employees can send an email with questions about Epic training or the scavenger hunt

Employees with questions about training for Epic, the new electronic medical record, can now email epic.trainer@omhs.org with those questions. In addition to training for Epic, there is a weekly scavenger hunt exercise. The Epic scavenger hunt is being sent out by the trainers to all end users that have attended the inpatient classroom training.

Here’s how the scavenger hunt is going to work. When employees find the answer to the exercise in Epic they can submit it to epic.trainer@omhs.org for a chance to win in a weekly drawing. Ten names will be randomly selected from the pool of employees with the correct answer. If an incorrect answer is submitted, those employees will be connected with their Super User for additional one-on-one training.

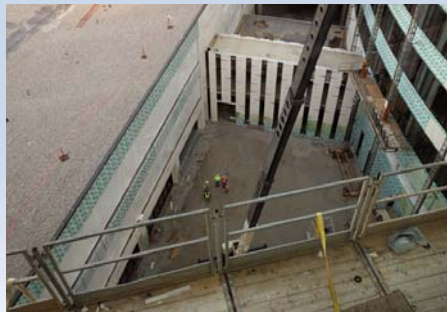

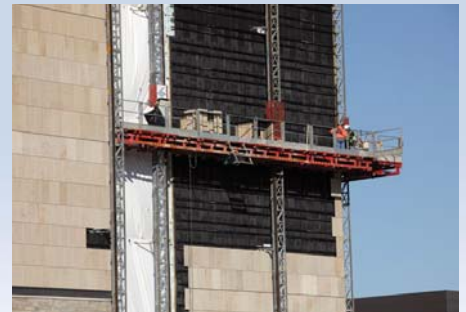
